Limitations and Conditions: The approval of this change in type design applies to the basic Cessna Model 207 series airplanes noted above. This approval should not be extended to other airplanes of these models on which other previously approved modification are incorporated unless it is determined by the installer that the interrelationships between this change and any of those other previously approved modification will introduce no adverse effect upon the airworthiness of that aircraft. This determination should include consideration of significant changes in weight or weight distribution.
